Forget ‘Network Publishing’. The future is ‘intelligent documents’, server software, online tax forms, personalised marketing, security and digital signatures.

Well, maybe not but the Acrobat User Forum is trying to continue discussion around pre-press **and** look at Reader Extensions, Document Server etc. and how they could be used in organisations. Things may turn out to be more coherent than sometimes appears.

The day meeting on June 2nd is now fully booked. It will include David Brailsford’s keynote from Seybold Amsterdam on XML and PDF and an update on the defra case study from David Stevenson. There will be a look at how to combine JDF and PDF online. For example, the Courier approach from Global Graphics and a new extension to Certified PDF from Enfocus.



There are still limited places for the evening session between 5 and 7 on June 2nd.
